RECENT ASSOCIATION EVENTS AND SUCCESSES

Successful 50th Anniversary Recognition!! On May 9, 2017, many long-time residents of Southern Gables were recognized as living in our neighborhood for at least 40 to 50 years. The approximately 165 in attendance saw pictures and memorabilia that showcased our neighborhood from 1965 to present. Perhaps most important, many of those neighbors had an opportunity to share their neighborhood experiences with new and older neighbors. A special THANK YOU to the many neighborhood volunteers who helped gather information from the many neighbors.

Did you know about Southern Gables History?

- 1. First filing for building homes was recorded April 8, 1963.
- 2. The Southern Gables HOA was formed in 1972.
- 3. The Southern Gables HOA began when Luby Chevrolet purchased the land at S. Wadsworth and W. Evans Ave. in 1972. Neighbors were very concerned about the impact on the neighborhood, and they developed a PUD plan with the City of Lakewood. The plan included indirect lighting, parking restrictions on W. Evans, requiring a berm on W. Evans and several other considerations which Joe Luby agreed. (Dealership under Luby and now Emich has worked very closely with the HOA and is a wonderful partner).
- 4. The Southern Gables HOA by-laws were written in March, 1973 and approved by the State of Colorado.
- 5. Southern Gables boundaries are S. Wadsworth to the east, Morrison Rd. to the south, W. Jewell Ave. to the north, and S. Garrison St. to the west. Approximately 955 single-family homes are located in this area.

Southern Gables Neighborhood Night Out was held August 25, 2017 at Green Gables Elementary. Approximately 545 neighbors enjoyed free food, visited 25 Business Sponsor booths, watched the circus, juggler, face and tattoo painting and toured our ever successful Community Garden. Four drawings for items of at least \$250.00 in value were held. Mark your calendar: next year's Neighborhood Night Out will be August 24, 2018.

LETTER FROM PRINCIPAL HAWLEY, GREEN GABLES ELEMENTARY

Leading, Learning, and Growing Together

Dear Green Gables Community, Happy Fall! It's hard to believe we are already almost half way through our first trimester of the school year. Things are off to a great start. There are many celebrations to share with the community:

- Our students have been busy in the community garden. We started the year with a school garden day which involved a garden tour learning about the various items all of the gardeners are growing. Students also tasted items from the school plots, learned how to care for their grade level plots, and listened to garden books with Christy Cerrrone's mom, Jan. This would not have been possible without our community volunteers (Bruce, Bonnie, Justina, Glenn, Christine, Christy, and Jan).
- Students have also used the garden to engage in authentic learning experiences involving math, science and writing. You might also notice students reading books outside in the outdoor learning space.
- This year we started a running club with the leadership of our PE teacher, Mrs. Miner, as well as other teachers and family volunteers. You may notice students running in the neighborhood after school twice a week. They are working hard to train for a 5k in November.

- Another proud moment came when the preliminary School Performance Framework (SPF) from the state was released. The SPF is a document that is used as part of the school accountability process to show academic achievement and growth. Our school rating based on last year was Performance Plan. This is up from the previous year (2015-16), which was Improvement Plan. There are four types of plans:
- 1. **Performance Plan** The school meets or exceeds statewide attainment on the performance indicators and is required to adopt and implement a Performance Plan.
- Improvement Plan The school is required to adopt and implement an Improvement Plan.
- 3. **Priority Improvement Plan** The school is required to adopt and implement a Priority Improvement Plan.
- 4. **Turnaround Plan** The school is required to adopt and implement a Turnaround Plan.

Our students made tremendous growth, and in some areas outperformed the state in reading and math growth! I contribute this to the hard work of our students, staff, families, and community members who all

- support the growth of our amazing children. I believe it takes an entire community working together and I am proud of our Green Gables
 Leprechauns! We still have much work to do and will always work within a cycle of continuous improvement.
- Finally, a big thank you to Westwood Community Church for the donations of school supplies and all the support you give our school. Thank you also to the Southern Gables Association for the various ways you support our school and give back to the community. I am humbled to serve as principal in this wonderful community and I welcome any ideas, suggestions, or volunteers. (We are still in need of crossing guards before and after school if you are interested.) Please feel free to reach out if you have any questions.
