- Friendly visiting
- Grocery shopping
- Reading to the visually impaired
- Providing help with filling out forms
- Assisting with organizational tasks
- Completing simple home repairs
- Providing occasional transportation to medical appointments

VIA has some volunteers available in the Southern Gables area! They recently connected with students from Colorado Christian University who are interested in helping out in the local community. If you or one of your neighbors could use some assistance in any of the areas mentioned above, they would love to hear from you! Southern Gables Block Parties

Back in 2021, after Neighborhood Night Out was summarily precluded by COVID, Neighborhood Association President Doug Whitten came up with the idea of sponsoring individual block parties, to be held out on the streets or driveways and front yards. People could mask up at their own discretion, keep their own distance, and still have some much-needed neighborly contact. We thought it would take the place of Neighborhood Night Out until we could resume the big event. It turns out — wouldn't you know it — it was so popular we decided to keep doing both! So, again this year we will sponsor block parties in July and early August, with stipends of \$100 to block party hosts. Apply by email to SGNA.Lakewood@gmail.com.

The city of Lakewood liked our idea so much they adopted it. The City's "Get Together" Program is intended to bring neighbors together around a shared purpose, activity or project. In addition to things like a neighborhood cleanup or an entryway beautification project, they will also fund block parties, with a limit up to \$500. They require an application and then submit a summary along with receipts and photos after the event. Details: Lakewood.org/GTgrant.

According to the Mayo Clinic, "Volunteers report better physical health than nonvolunteers. Research also has shown that volunteering leads to lower rates of depression and anxiety, especially for people 65 and older.

"Volunteering reduces stress and increases positive, relaxed feelings by releasing dopamine. By spending time in service to others, volunteers report feeling a sense of meaning and appreciation, both given and received, which can have a stress-reducing effect."
