# Volunteer? It's a good way to add enjoyment to life.

Volunteering can make you feel good. Some people say that means volunteers are selfish, doing things for others just for the benefit it gives them back. Ha! Don't let that stop you. The good that is done for the receiver is no small thing, however. Just to pick a random example, what if you were elderly or disabled and your house was getting neglected and the neighbors were calling the City to complain about it... and then someone came along and volunteered to paint it? Painting won't fix everything, but it helps make a neighborhood nicer.

**PAINT-A-THON** is a community-driven program sponsored by Brothers Redevelopment. It provides free exterior house painting services to older adults and individuals with disabilities who need help maintaining their homes. *You can do this.* 

We can get up a group and volunteer. With at least 8 neighbors, we can organize and choose a project date that works best for us. The company provides all materials, safety equipment, and supervision. No prior experience needed! Paint-A-Thon Volunteer Day is July 19, 2025.

**TO SIGN UP** as a volunteer from Southern Gables, email us at SGNA.Lakewood@gmail.com and we'll put a list together. We will assemble a neighborhood group if there are enough volunteers, or if not then we'll see that you get connected to join others on Volunteer Day, July 19 2025. Get others to sign up with you, as a Southern Gables group or as individuals joining other groups! Decide and do it soon, even though July seem a long way off.

Another way you can help is by referring homeowners who may qualify for free painting services. If you know an older adult or individual with disabilities who owns and occupies their home and may need assistance, we encourage you to share this opportunity with them.

**TO APPLY** to have your house painted or to recommend others to have theirs done, email us (same as above) and we will point you to the application form.

## Spring? Already? Time to get going!

It's that time of year where we start to come outside more, and this year has given us many warm days to work on our yards. One thing that I love about living in a 60year-old neighborhood is the diverse landscapes. The various ways we choose to landscape our yards adds to our neighborhood's charm.

Are you thinking of adding a new garden to your yard? One way to start a new garden is to cut down whatever is in the area where you want your garden as far down as you can (You do not need to dig it all up). Add a layer of cardboard and then a deep layer of mulch. You can also add some topsoil before the mulch. The best time to do this is in the fall, but the next best time is now. The cardboard will break apart and will create great soil for new plants. The key is patience... just let it sit, preferably until the cardboard breaks down, and that may take months. Regularly watering it helps the process speed up a bit. Even before it's all decomposed you can dig up where you add a plant and keep the cardboard in the rest of the area.

You will also want to give your yard some water, if we don't get any rain or snow. I try to do this once a week if there is no moisture. The number one way you will lose your flowers or plants here is lack of water. If you can wait to cut back your flowers from last year, you may be saving the eggs of some of the bugs that are good for the garden such as ladybugs and butterflies. You won't hear them thanking you, but they definitely will!

#### City of Lakewood Mulch Giveaway Saturdays May 3 and 10, from 7 AM to 3 PM

Lakewood residents can get free mulch at the City Greenhouse, 9556 W Yale Ave. City staff workers will be available to assist with loading. Saturdays May 3 and 11, from 7 AM to 3 pm.

According to the Lakewood Forestry Department, Mulch helps landscaped areas retain water, which reduces the need for watering. It also assists with keeping soil temperatures consistent, which promotes the establishment of root systems. Mulch is an excellent weed barrier and beautifies landscaping.
